Workforce Training Opportunities

EmployIndy guides the local workforce ecosystem and makes strategic investments to remove barriers to quality employment for underserved and underrepresented residents.

When it comes to building a career, it's a journey not a destination. Our goal at EmployIndy is to help residents find jobs and develop a work history. After demonstrating on-the-job competencies, we empower individuals to take on additional responsibilities that align with higher pay and continued learning opportunities. Finally, we match persons with interest and aptitude to high-demand fields that help grow our local economy.

ABC: Any Job, Better Job, Career

In an effort to help residents move along the ABC continuum, EmployIndy has compiled a resource guide that outlines available resources for training. Attached you will find a comprehensive overview of the July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018 funding available for occupational skills training in Central Indiana. We share this document in the spirit of transparency, and to encourage residents to take advantage of opportunities to skill-up and secure employment in high-demand fields.

FAQs for Participants

Can you assist with training?

EmployIndy and WorkOne Indy can help participants with career exploration and job market opportunities. This includes providing tools for you to assess your interests and skills. Once you have determined what career path you want to take, WorkOne Indy can continue to support you through identifying training providers and funding sources for the training. WorkOne Indy has access to some training funds for eligible individuals and continues to source additional funding. WorkOne Indy staff might also be able to identify free online training for the skills you need as well as provide free access to computers and internet service at our offices.

When are you going to have funding for training?

There are funds available currently for eligible individuals in a few different programs.

- ★ **WorkIndiana funding** provides training assistance for individuals who are basic skill deficient (often individuals enrolled in Adult Basic Education are eligible) as well as individuals receiving SNAP/TANF benefits.
- ★ **WIOA training funding** is a limited type of funding, which provides training assistance for individuals who would like to enter into a high-wage or high-demand career. In order to be eligible, individuals must work closely with their career coach to complete all necessary paperwork, including a drug screen and background check.
 - Also, individuals must choose an eligible training provider by going to webapps.dwd.in.gov/INTraining/ and selecting the appropriate search criteria. Sometimes, when funding is limited, veterans (and their spouses) and individuals with less income are a priority.
- ★ **EmployUp** is another program, designed for the long-term unemployed or underemployed who have some college experience. Learn more at employup.org.
- ★ **Next Level Jobs Indiana** Next Level Jobs is part of Governor Holcomb's Next Level Indiana agenda with a focus on the high-priority industries and high-demand jobs driving Indiana's 21st Century economy forward. Learn details at www.nextleveljobs.org/2017.

FAQs for Community Organizations & Service Providers

We have career services as a part of our current programming - why should we have our clients enroll into your program(s) as we both provide the same or similar services?

The goal of WorkOne Indy is not just to provide funding for training, but also to help support your current programs. Many community based organizations have comprehensive employment programs, but could still benefit from our services. WorkOne Indy can provide assessments (i.e. TABE, WorkKeys, cTORQ), training workshops (i.e., interviewing skills, LinkedIn, networking, job search), assist with mock interviews, help with special populations (veterans, re-entry), or provide support when your caseload grows. The WorkOne Indy team can also provide direction to other programs offered through EmployIndy.

Do clients who are enrolled with you receive preferential treatment from employers when hiring decisions are made?

EmployIndy has a team of recruiters and business services representatives who are working to connect all of our partners' clients with appropriate employers in the community. All community-based organizations and WorkOne locations have the opportunity to create recommendations for job-ready individuals in the system, and it is the responsibility of EmployIndy's business team to work to place these individuals.

WorkOne Indy

Funding Source(s): WIOA Title I (Department of Workforce Development)

Case Management System(s): indianacareerconnect.com

Program Purpose:

WorkOne programs help residents find a new or better job, choose a career, access training, and/or get the information needed to succeed in the job market. WIOA is intended to align the workforce system with education and economic development needs of the local area to create a collective response to labor market challenges.

Eligibility Criteria:

Adult:

- ★ Age 18 or older

Dislocated Worker:

- ★ No age requirement
- ★ Meets 1/5 eligibility categories

Out-of-School Youth:

- ★ Age 16-24 and out of school
- ★ Meets 1/9 barriers or is low income

Enrollment Requirements: For basic services (workshops, etc.): completed application, eligibility determination, related proof of identification, receive staff-assisted service. For to be eligible for training funds: DWD requires participants to pass drug screen and background check, males 18 and older must be registered with the selective service

Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG)

Funding Source(s): WIOA Title I & State of Indiana (Dept. of Workforce Development)

Case Management System(s): indianacareerconnect.com, jag.org/endms

Program Purpose:

JAG is a state-based national non-profit organization dedicated to preventing dropouts among young people who are most at-risk. JAG helps young people stay in school through graduation, pursue post-secondary education and secure quality entry-level jobs leading to career advancement opportunities.

Eligibility Criteria:

In-School Youth:

- ★ Age 16-19 and attending a high school hosting the JAG program
- ★ Live in a low-income household
- ★ Barrier to succeeding in post-secondary education or employment

*Any males 18 and older seeking this funding must be registered with the selective service

Enrollment Requirements: Transcripts, completed JAG application, related proof of identification, proof of low-income status (not required for state-funded JAG)

Community-Based Workforce Development (CDBG)

Funding Source(s): HUD Community Development Block Grant (City of Indianapolis)

Case Management System(s): Sub-grantees are required to leverage existing case management systems to track participant activities

Program Purpose:

Community-based organizations working with unemployed and underemployed residents provide neighborhood-based workforce services by offering a variety of individualized, culturally appropriate services that bring workers into the mainstream economy through jobs offering the promise of financial stability and pathways to careers.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Low to moderate income Marion County residents
- ★ Persons who have total household income equal to or less than 80% of the median family income for the county in which the project is located
 - ★ Income parameters are defined by HUD section 8 Housing Assistance Program

Enrollment Requirements: Eligibility determination, related proof of identification documentation, a form or other written indication that the individual has been enrolled in the program.

Youth Employment Services (YES)

Funding Source(s): Lilly Endowment, Inc.

Case Management System(s): www.ipicyes.com

Program Purpose:

YES moves youth and young adults towards self-sufficiency through education, training, and employment. Community-based organizations provide programming and remove barriers to effectively serve vulnerable, hard-to-employ youth and young adults.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Vulnerable youth with financial need
- ★ Age 17-25
 - ★ Not enrolled in high school; graduates and dropouts eligible
 - ★ Resident of Marion County
 - ★ A U.S. citizen or eligible to work in US

Enrollment Requirements: Completed YES Program application, TABE Survey assessment, and Individual Service Strategy (or comparable document) developed that identifies the plan of service for the client

YouthBuild Indy (YBI)

Funding Source(s): WIOA Title I & Indianapolis Neighborhood Housing Partnership

Case Management System(s): indianacareerconnect.com, workoneindy.org

Program Purpose:

YBI provides the opportunity and support needed to earn a High School Equivalency Diploma; identify and begin a path to a high-demand career; transition into college or vocational training; receive credentialed construction training; develop critical, on-the-job work experience and soft skills; develop leadership and other key personal skills; and take advantage of a key opportunity to improve the quality of life in Indianapolis by transforming abandoned, blighted homes into valuable, low-income housing.

Eligibility Criteria:

Out-of-School Youth and Young Adults

- ★ Age 18-24 without a high school diploma
- ★ Low income
- ★ Barriers to self-sufficient employment

Enrollment Requirements: Program application, eligibility determination TABE, program Interview, orientation

Employ Up

Funding Source(s): H-1B Ready to Work Grant (U.S. Dept. of Labor)

Case Management System(s): myemployup.org/

Program Purpose:

Employ Up is a comprehensive program that provides individually appropriate specialized services and education/training so individuals can embark on or complete career paths in STEM/technical occupations.

Eligibility Criteria:

Long-term unemployed and underemployed (career changers)

- ★ Age 18+
- ★ Some post-secondary education and/or work experience
- ★ Unemployed or underemployed for 27 weeks or longer

Enrollment Requirements: Opt-in to program (agree to mental health assessment and to attend career development phase, complete all assessments, proof of identification, receive program enrollment service)

LEAP

Funding Source(s): *Linking to Employment Activities Pre-release (U.S. Dept. of Labor)*

Case Management System(s): workoneindy.org

Program Purpose:

LEAP links transitioning sentenced offenders in the Marion County Jail with a range of community-based workforce services pre-release that prepare them for employment and increase their opportunities for successful re-entry into Marion County.

Eligibility Criteria:

Sentenced offenders confined in Marion County Jail

- ★ Convicted as an adult and imprisoned under County law
- ★ Sexual offenses other than prostitution are not eligible
- ★ Release date scheduled within 180 days of enrollment in the program

Enrollment Requirements: *Eligibility determination, program application, program orientation*

Project Indy

Funding Source(s): *Career Pathways Youth Grant (U.S. Dept. of Labor)*

Case Management System(s): *Sub-grantees are required to leverage existing case management systems to track participant activities*

Program Purpose:

Project Indy is the City's unified summer jobs program, providing meaningful opportunities for youth workers with limited current or past work experiences, plus entry to a career pathway through placement in unsubsidized employment or post-secondary education or training. Project Indy enhances the capacity of existing summer employment programs and expands access to work readiness/employability skills training and work experiences throughout the year in high-poverty, high-crime Indianapolis neighborhoods.

Eligibility Criteria:

In-school and Out-of-School Youth

- ★ Ages 16-24
- ★ New entrants to the workforce or limited work experience

Enrollment Requirements: *TABE assessment, eligibility determination, related proof of identification, participant commitment*

Re-employment Services & Eligibility Assessment (RESEA)

Funding Source(s): WIOA (Department of Workforce Development)

Case Management System(s): indianacareerconnect.com

Program Purpose:

RESEA assists unemployment insurance (UI) claimants through early intervention to aid in a quicker return to meaningful employment, eliminating UI fraud, and providing a savings to the UI fund.

Eligibility Criteria:

UI claimants likely to exhaust benefits prior to re-employment

- ★ Non-job-attached claimants are assessed and selected upon filing UI claims in week four as initial participants
- ★ Initial participants still collecting UI at fifteen weeks are required to re-engage as part of the subsequent RESEA services

Enrollment Requirements: TABE assessment, eligibility determination, related proof of identification, participant commitment

Opportunity Youth Pilot

Funding Source(s): WIOA (Department of Workforce Development)

Case Management System(s): indianacareerconnect.com

Program Purpose:

Opportunity Youth Pilot supports programs which respond to the unique needs of out-of-school youth and young adults. Services prepare youth with 21st century skills through innovative methods of outreach and engagement, and facilitate transition to career pathways toward self-sufficiency.

Eligibility Criteria:

Out-of-School youth

- ★ Ages 16-24
- ★ Youth and young adults with barriers to employment and training
- ★ Residents of the neighborhoods that make up the Near East (46201), North West (46208), Mid-North (46205), North East Corridor (46218), and Far East (46235) are given priority

Enrollment Requirements: Completed application, eligibility determination, related proof of identification, receive staff-assisted service

WorkINDiana

Funding Source(s): State of Indiana (Dept. of Workforce Development)

Case Management System(s): InTERS Data System

Vocational Rehabilitation Services (VR)

<p>Program Purpose:</p> <p>VR provides quality individualized services to enhance and support people with disabilities to prepare for, obtain or retain employment. The individual will work closely with a VR counselor throughout the process. Adult Education

Funding Source(s): WIOA Title II (Department of Workforce Development)

Case Management System(s): InTERS Data System

Program Purpose: Adult Education helps Hoosiers acquire the knowledge, skills, and abilities required for employment, careers, and post-secondary education through Adult Education and Literacy Activities, Corrections Education and Education for Institutionalized Individuals, and Integrated Education and Training.

Eligibility Criteria:

- ★ Age 18+ or age 16-18 if a principal authorizes a student exit form
- ★ Requires skill development or remediation, or both, in English, math, or reading as determined by an initial assessment

Enrollment Requirements: Pretest to determine skill level, Twelve attendance hours of instruction and orientation

Centers for Working Families

Funding Source(s): United Way of Central Indiana, Corporation for National and Community Service & Philanthropic Funders

Case Management System(s): Efforts to Outcomes

Program Purpose: CWF improves the financial bottom line for low-income families by helping people boost earnings, reduce expenses, and build assets. A range of financial, employment, and income support services are integrated, all in a single location, and delivered through personalized, one-on-one coaching.

Eligibility Criteria: Varies among the network of community-based organizations which include eight United Way agencies, Ivy Tech Community College, and Public Advocates in Community re-Entry (PACE)

Enrollment Requirements: Varies by agency. All include income support assessments and financial assessments

The Workforce Ready Grant targets in-demand occupations within high-growth sectors of Indiana's economy – Advanced Manufacturing, Building & Construction, Health & Life Sciences, IT & Business Services, and Transportation & Logistics.
